Proposed Itinerary for an Afternoon Walk in Palermo

From Liberty Avenue to the Sea


 *Visit the Botanical Garden (Orto Botanico di Palermo)*

Reach the peaceful Botanical Garden, a true green oasis founded in 1789. Stroll among centuries-old trees, tropical plants, and rare species. It's one of the most important botanical gardens in Europe.

 Suggested visit: 1 hour


 *Piazza Marina & Palazzo Chiaramonte-Steri (Rectorate of the University)*

Head to Piazza Marina, a charming square shaded by ancient ficus trees. Here you can visit the Palazzo Chiaramonte-Steri, today home to the Rectorate of the University of Palermo. Inside, explore historical rooms and learn about the Inquisition Tribunal once held here.

 Suggested visit: 30 minutes

 *Church of La Gancia*

Just a few steps away is the Church of La Gancia, a Renaissance-Baroque church famous for its ornate stuccoes and its connection to Palermo's revolutionary past.

 Suggested visit: 10 minutes

Church of La Catena (Santa Maria della Catena)

Continue your walk toward the picturesque Church of Santa Maria della Catena, overlooking the old port. The church is a rare example of Catalan-Gothic style in Palermo and offers a serene atmosphere.

 Suggested visit: 10 minutes

Visit to the Historic Vucciria Market

No visit to Palermo is complete without experiencing the unique atmosphere of the **Vucciria Market**. Once one of the city's most vibrant and bustling markets, Vucciria still echoes with the energy of its past—where loud vendors (known as *abbanniatùri*) shouted their prices in Sicilian dialect, and the scent of spices, fish, and street food filled the air.

Today, Vucciria blends history with a gritty charm: though much quieter during the day, it remains a symbol of Palermo's soul. You'll find local artists' studios, traditional food stalls, crumbling yet fascinating architecture, and the famous "**Ficus**" courtyard, where street food and nightlife come alive after sunset. It's a place where time stands still, capturing the layered history and multicultural essence of the city.

Don't miss: A plate of *pane con la milza* (spleen sandwich), grilled octopus, or a cold beer at one of the open-air taverns as the evening begins.

Church of San Giorgio dei Genovesi

Nearby stands the Church of San Giorgio dei Genovesi, built in the late Renaissance by the wealthy Genoese community. Its refined façade and artworks reflect the maritime power of the time.

 Suggested visit: 15 minutes

Stroll through the historic port area

Enjoy a slow stroll along Via Cala and toward the recently redeveloped waterfront promenade, taking in the atmosphere of the old port, the fishing boats, and the sea breeze.

7:00 PM – *Arrival at Molo Trapezoidale*

Reach the Trapezoidal Pier, a modern open-air space on the water, perfect for enjoying the sunset and sea views.

7:30 PM – **Dinner at "Curma"**

Enjoy dinner at Curma, a stylish restaurant located right on the pier, offering fresh seafood, Sicilian specialties, and a relaxed atmosphere by the water.

10:00 PM – *Dancing Fountains Show*

Conclude your evening with the magical **Dancing Fountains Show**, a spectacle of lights, music, and water jets at the Molo Trapezoidale, perfect for relaxing after dinner.
